Tasted by [drdebs](#) on 7/15/2007 & rated **91 points**: OK, this may be the best bottle of rosé I've had all summer--and I've had few. Deep, rich color. Floral aromas mix with whiffs of pretty raspberry and strawberry. On the palate, the first taste you get is pure strawberry essence, with a note of watermelon on the finish. Has some streaks of mineral running through it, too. Round, rich, dry. Very, very nice. Great that's it's made with 100% grenache. Makes it perfect for BBQ, though we had it with pork lo mein and it was pretty good with that, too. Outstanding for \$7.99. (82 views)

Taste: Gorgeous ruby red color. Aromas of watermelon, strawberry and white pepper. Tastes like a watermelon jolly rancher candy but finishes dry and crisp. This Rosé is juicy with oodles of watermelon, strawberry and raspberries that greet you right up front. Excellently structured with some nice depth here, a little touch of white pepper lingers on the finish. This wine calls for summer BBQ's filled with grilled vegetables, seafood and great for picnics! Even in the hot tub! (121 views)



Tasted by [dmatley](#) on 7/8/2007 & rated **90 points**: After a summer of candied and hot roses what a treat this was. Beautiful medium ruby in the glass. Floral, slightly earthy nose. Wonderful companion to South Indian cuisine. The grenache fruit is nicely extracted and structured with an earthy component and a nice dry finish. As the wine came down in temperature I kept waiting to feel the heat since this is labeled 14% but it never once tasted hot. I picked this up on a whim as we drove through Mountain View on the way to dinner. I can't wait for it to hit our local Costco as a case is surely in order for this Spanish beauty. (189 views)
